The lot marked out for me is my delight: welcome indeed the heritage that falls to me!


I will bless the Lord who gives me counsel, who even at night directs my heart.

Come and hear, all who fear God. I will tell what he did for my soul: to him I cried aloud, with high praise ready on my tongue.


If there had been evil in my heart, the Lord would not have listened; But truly God has listened; he has heeded the voice of my prayer.

You have prepared a banquet for me in the sight of my foes.


My head you have anointed with oil; my cup is overflowing.

It is the Lord who loves the just but thwarts the path of the wicked. The Lord will reign for ever, Zion's God, from age to age.





The Lord ransoms the souls of his servants.



I kept my feet firmly in your paths; there was no faltering in my steps.


