- Out of the depths I cry to you, O Lord, Lord, <u>hear</u> my voice! O let your ears <u>be</u> attentive to the voice <u>of</u> my pleading.
- If you, O Lord, should <u>mark</u> our guilt, Lord, who <u>would</u> survive? But with you is <u>found</u> forgiveness: for this <u>we</u> revere you.
- My soul is waiting <u>for</u> the Lord, I count <u>on</u> his word. My soul is longing for the Lord more than watch<u>man</u> for daybreak. (Let the watchman count on daybreak and Israel <u>on</u> the Lord.)
- Because with the Lord <u>there</u> is mercy and fullness <u>of</u> redemption, Israel indeed he <u>will</u> redeem from all <u>its</u> iniquity.
